

Peterson Pier Project Committee Meeting Minutes 05/28/2020

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m.

Present were Chairperson Chris Oatman along with members Judy Peterson, Dave Krochalk and Scott Popelka. The committee had not met for several months and wanted to reset priorities and what should be our focus at this time. The scope of the project was also discussed. Popelka affirmed that the Langlade County road project on Highway M around the lake would not be done this year. Peterson suggested we see if Highway Commission Brian Braun could come to one of our meetings to provide input on that pending project and how our committee's possible plans could be affected. It was also suggested we contact the new Lake Association President to get him involved. Peterson noted the Surface Water Grant Program is being revised. If passed, she would work-on a grant application. She also recommended looking into county regulations on shoreline restoration, along with other grants, resources and funding that may be available. We discussed needed repairs to the boat ramp and if that would be part of the pier project. Krochalk provided information about the services Green Bay Concrete could provide in that area. It was suggested we check with Village Trustee Patsy Listle for input on whether a permit was required for ramp maintenance. Rip-rap regulations for the shoreline and the power loading issue need further exploration. Peterson showed plans for a Voyager Standing Dock from Dvorak's Dock and has provided funding for the dock and installation. Additional avenues of funding and publicity will be explored. It was agreed that an important next step would be to contact Kyle McLaughlin and/or Sarah Szabo from the DNR Waterways Team and see if one of them could attend a pier committee meeting in the near future to answer questions and provide information, including grant opportunities. Motion and second by Peterson/Krochalk to adjourn. All aye, motion carried. Oatman did not note the exact time of adjournment which was approximately 10:55 a.m.
